

ALAS Network begins a new chapter under the leadership of Carmen Hein de Campos.



The ALAS Network is proud to announce the election of Professor **Carmen Hein de Campos** as its **new General Coordinator** for the **2025–2027** term. Her election marks a historic moment for the Network, as she becomes the first Brazilian, feminist, and non-Spanish-speaking coordinator, strengthening ALAS Network's regional reach and inclusive identity.



Hein de Campos is a visiting professor in the Law Graduate Program at the Universidade Federal de Pelotas (UFPel). She has an outstanding career in feminist criminology, human rights, gender-based violence, and public policy. She has worked with UN Women and the Brazilian Presidency and served as a key advisor to Brazil's National Congress on women's protection laws.

Within ALAS Network, she has co-edited the book *Criminologías feministas*, contributed to conferences and editorial initiatives, and currently serves on the editorial board of *Revista IGAL*.



This leadership transition reaffirms the ALAS Network's commitment to democratic, transparent, and diverse governance. Hein de Campos's leadership plan focuses on **strengthening regional alliances, consolidating institutional processes, and amplifying the impact of collaborative research in law, gender, and justice.**



"We want to build a Network that is both a space of care and of critical intervention—a Network grounded in collective intelligence and the power of our shared commitments to transform the law in Latin America," said Hein de Campos.
