

ALAS Network begins a new chapter under the leadership of Carmen Hein de Campos.







The ALAS Network is proud to announce the election of Professor Carmen Hein de Campos as its new General Coordinator for the 2025–2027 term. Her election marks a historic moment for the Network, as she becomes the first Brazilian, feminist, and non-Spanish-speaking coordinator, strengthening ALAS Network's regional reach and inclusive identity.





Hein de Campos is a visiting professor in the Law Graduate Program at the Universidade Federal de Pelotas (UFPel). She has an outstanding career in feminist criminology, human rights, gender-based violence, and public policy. She has worked with UN Women and the Brazilian Presidency and served as a key advisor to Brazil's National Congress on women's protection laws.

Within ALAS Network, she has co-edited the book Criminologías feministas, contributed to conferences and editorial initiatives, and currently serves on the editorial board of Revista IGAL.





This leadership transition reaffirms the ALAS Network's commitment to democratic, transparent, and diverse governance. Hein de Campos's leadership plan focuses on strengthening regional alliances, consolidating institutional processes, and amplifying the impact of collaborative research in law, gender, and justice.



"We want to build a Network that is both a space of care and of critical intervention—a Network grounded in collective intelligence and the power of our shared commitments to transform the law in Latin America," said Hein de Campos.
